he City of Southfield is offering water bill rebates to neighborhood and condominium associations who maintain their entranceways through either installed irrigation systems or by manual irrigation maintenance.

The Residential Entranceway Appearance Program (REAP) will award rebates (up to \$500 for installed irrigation system maintenance; or up to \$250 for manual irrigation maintenance) to the first 40 neighborhoods who enroll and meet the criteria standards.

The rebates are intended to encourage community enhancement efforts through the involvement of neighborhood and condominium groups and reward them when they achieve their goals.

Neighborhood and condominium groups must fill out the application (listed on the back of this brochure or downloaded from the Southfield Web site:

www.cityofsouthfield.com) and detail WHEN their irrigation system runs, WHERE it is located and the amount of the last water bill.

The application must be returned by October 31 each year to the Neighborhood and Information

Center located at 26000 Evergreen Road (inside city hall) and a representative will follow-up with your association.





## Second-tier REAP water rebate

The program also features a secondtier water rate rebate of up to \$250 for neighborhoods that don't have an irrigation system, however still find ways to maintain their entranceways through manual irrigation.

When filling out a REAP application, associations must show (either through photographs or other means) that the manual watering of their entranceway yielded tangible results. They also must show WHO is designated to irrigate the entranceway and HOW often it is watered in order to be eligible to receive the second tier incentive of up to \$250.

The incentive program is administered by the City's Neighborhood and Information Center and its standards criteria committee who review the completed application and determine the amount of the rebate that will be awarded. Applications for second-tier water rate rebates must also be received by October 31 annually.

Neighborhood associations that do not currently have an irrigation system installed may also apply for a grant of up to \$500 to be applied towards the instal-

lation of a system. The program is one of many created by the city to promote Southfield's strategic efforts to maintain high curb appeal standards and to keep the city beautiful.

## CITY OF SOUTHFIELD

REAP landscape and irrigation requirements for reimbursement

- 1. All existing or proposed landscape and irrigation systems shall meet or exceed the general requirements and specifications of the City of Southfield's Planning Department (copies available on request).
- 2. All plant material shall be premium quality (nursery grade #1).
- 3. Only improved landscaped beds that include trees, shrubs, perennials or annual flowers (in healthy growing condition) will be eligible for reimbursement.
- 4. Soil shall be backfilled directly behind all curbs and along sidewalks and compacted to the top of curbs or walks to support vehicle and pedestrians without settling.
- 5. All trees and shrubs shall be no closer than the following distances from sidewalks, curbs and parking stalls:

Shade/Canopy Trees Ornamental/Flowering Evergreen Trees Evergreen/Flowering

- 6. All shrub beds must be mulched with shredded bark mulch to a 3" minimum depth and lawn trees with a minimum 4' wide by 4" deep shredded bark ring. Only natural—colored double shredded hardwood bark mulch may be used.
- 7. The irrigation of all plants, shrubs and trees shall continue for the entire growing season or as the weather dictates. Irrigation systems shall have separate zones to minimize overwatering.
- 8. All landscape shall be free of weeds, dead or diseased material, trash and debris, and shall be pruned, mowed or otherwise maintained in a timely fashion to improve appearances and remove hazards.
